Subject: Academic Elective

Required Prerequisites: AP Seminar

Suggested Prerequisites: None

Recommended Grade Levels: Grades 11-12

Duration: Yearlong

Required Course Materials:

- College Board Account. If you do not have a College Board account, you can sign up at the <u>College Board student registration webpage (opens in a new</u> <u>window)</u>. This account allows you to view AP Scores, SAT scores, and various AP test-related resources.
- My AP Account. You will need create a My AP account (opens in a new window) with the College Board. Your instructor will explain how you will use My AP during the course and the AP Digital Portfolio make your final submissions to the College Board at the end of the course.
- Google or Office 356 Account. You will receive instructions in the course on how to set up Google or Office 365 folders for your PREP Portfolio.
- **Video Camera**. You will need access to a phone, camera, or computer so that you can record video presentations.

Course Description

AP Research, the second course in the AP Capstone experience, allows students to deeply explore an academic topic, problem, issue, or idea of individual interest. Students design, plan, and implement a yearlong investigation to address a research question. Through this inquiry, they further the skills they acquired in the AP Seminar course by learning research methodology, employing ethical research practices, and accessing, analyzing, and synthesizing information. Students reflect on their skill development, document their processes, and curate the artifacts of their scholarly work through a process and reflection portfolio. The course culminates in an academic paper of 4,000-5,000 words (accompanied by a performance, exhibit, or product where applicable) and a presentation with an oral defense.

- Unit 5: Presenting Your Research (Team, Transform, and Transmit)
- Final Unit: Final Assessments
