Subject: English

Required Prerequisites: There are no prerequisite courses for AP English Literature and Composition.

Suggested Prerequisites: Students should be able to read and comprehend collegelevel texts and write grammatically correct, complete sentences.

Recommended Grade Levels: 11th and 12th Grade

Duration: Yearlong

Textbook: There is not a textbook required for this class. Any additionally required materials are listed in the Required Course Materials Section. There is a college-level textbook in the course that students can use as an additional resource: "Writing and Literature: Composition as Inquiry, Learning, Thinking, and Communication" (2018). Required Course Materials: Almost all of the texts you will use are accessible through the course. In Unit 9, you will have the option to choose from two novels linked in the course (*My Antonia* from Willa Cather and *Cry, The Beloved Country* by Alan Paton) or to obtain a copy of one of the following texts.

- A Thousand Splendid Suns by Khaled Hosseini
- The Orphan Master's Son by Adam Johnson

• *Five Little Indians* by Michelle Good

Course Description

AP English Literature and Composition will expose you to a diverse selection of academic and historical fiction that will help you build a critical understanding of literature (and the world in general). Reading a variety of texts, including some of your own choosing, you will:

- Examine choices that writers make and the techniques that they utilize to achieve their purpose and generate meaning.
- Explore traditionally-studied and lesser-known works from diverse authors throughout history.
- Analyze and interpret literary works by creating expository, analytical, and argumentative essays.
- Describe how the author develops theme and purpose through the strategical use of various literary devices and/or elements of fiction.

This course will strengthen your critical analysis skills, improve your writing abilities and help you develop a vocabulary that allows you to articulate your thoughts coherently and academically. The ability to analyze sources critically and clearly communicate your understanding is a skill that will benefit you in any path that you choose in life. Moreover, as a byproduct of this course, you will develop perseverance and time management skills.
