Course Description

The course serves as an introduction to art history beginning with Mesopotamian and Egyptian civilizations to modern century artists. During the semester, students will survey a variety of

images and monuments produced throughout history, focusing on European and non-western art and architecture. Students will analyze the works of the past, historian interpretations, and the ideological and societal contexts of the images. Likewise, students will demonstrate an awareness of artistic styles and developments in relationship to their ideological and historical contexts through a variety of projects and forum discussion groups.

Scope and Sequence

Unit 01: Orientation & Introduction

 Students will learn the skills required to navigate and participate in this course.

Unit 02: Introduction to Ancient Near Eastern Art

 Scope and Analysis: A look at the art and architecture from the earliest of civilizations, many of which had a pivotal impact on today's world cultures

Unit 03: Ancient Greek, Etruscan and Roman Art

 Scope and Analysis: A look at works that have influenced both art and architecture the world over

• Unit 04: Early Christian, Medieval, Byzantine, Islamic and South Asian Art

 Scope and Analysis: A look at the artwork and architecture from the Early Christian and Medieval world, along with Early Islamic and South Asian art

Unit 05: Romanesque and Gothic Art

 Scope and Analysis: A look at art and architecture from 1,000 A.D. to the 13th, 14th and 15th Centuries and into Japan

Unit 06: Renaissance, Baroque and Rococo Art

 Scope and Analysis: A look at art and architectural works from the artistic powerhouse that was the Italian Renaissance and into the periods of art that followed

Unit 07: Late 18th - 19th Century Art/ West Africa

 Scope and Analysis: A look at art and architectural works from the 18th and 19th Centuries, along with works from West Africa.

Unit 08: 20th Century Art

 Scope and Analysis: A look at how art has been used to express individual concerns of changing political views and social awareness through modern times.

Unit 09: Review and Final Exam
