Course Description

Economics is the study of how people use limited resources. In this course, we will examine the decision-making process in using those resources, how markets develop to move those resources, how the government oversees those markets, and how those markets have developed to become global in scope. The course curriculum satisfies the South Carolina state standards in Economics.

The curriculum used in this course is guided by the <u>Economics and Personal Finance</u> 2020 SCSSCCR Standards (opens in a new window).

The Honors level Economics and Personal Finance course is designed to give students the opportunity to engage in a higher level of analysis and require students to consider different economic sectors and infrastructures. Students are required to apply independent research skills and critical thinking on economic topics that require sophisticated financial understanding, interpret economic data, make complex evaluations in determining the cause and effect, and present ways to prevent similar economic conditions in the future.
