Course Description

This course is the third in a series which allows students to continue developing proficiency in speaking, listening, writing, and reading by interacting with other speakers of the French language in accordance with the American Council on the Teaching of Foreign Languages (ACTFL) standards and be able to demonstrate knowledge of and appreciation of cultural differences. This course will provide students with the opportunity to perform basic tasks in the language that would allow for survival in Francophone culture, apply skills and demonstrate confidence to communicate effectively with a variety of audiences—one-on-one, small group, and large groups—using forums and live sessions, and to use a variety of resources to broaden understanding of world events/issues and connections to daily life at home and in Francophone cultures.

The expected proficiency range for this course is Novice High-Intermediate Low. The proficiency definitions used in this course are guided by the <u>ACTFL Proficiency</u> <u>Guidelines</u> (opens in a new window).

The curriculum used in this course is guided by the <u>South Carolina Standard for World</u> <u>Language Proficiency</u> (opens in a new window).
